

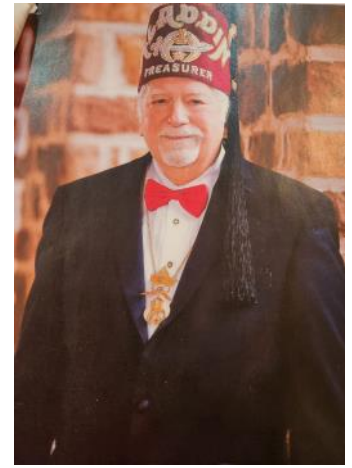

Payment Requirements: Accommodations in each category at the discount/group rates are limited and subject to availability. Reservations are made on a first-come, first-served basis, while supply lasts. **Deposit:** A standard deposit of \$350 USD per person is required.

Final Payment: The balance is due in full no later than December 18, 2026. Additional payments are accepted at anytime until final payment. Cruise payments can be made by check or credit card. Discounted group rates may not be combinable with other discounts or coupons.

Holland America considers the day prior to the departure date as the first day. You must contact MAGIC by 5:00pm EST the business day before the penalty period begins to avoid the fee. Travel Insurance may also protect you against cancellation fees.

Travel Insurance: Policies are available for purchase to protect you in case the unexpected does occur. Travel insurance provides coverage for events such as trip cancellation, interruption, damaged baggage, and medical expenses. The Holland America Cancellation Protection cost or Allianz Group Advantage cost is based on your cruise price. Some restrictions and limitations do apply. Policies are available only to US residents. Plans must be purchased or declined in writing no later than final payment. Some restrictions apply.

Proof of Citizenship: A valid US passport book is the best form of ID for this trip—valid for 6 months after the return date. It is the responsibility of all non-U.S. citizens to check with the local immigration office, embassy, or consulate to determine document requirements. There is no refund for denied boarding due to lack of proper documents.

Airfare: Holland America's Flight Ease program is available to book from most major airports. You also have the option to book your own airfare directly with your preferred airline. Airfare payments and cancellation fees are subject to separate terms and conditions (many flights are non-refundable). Ask MAGIC if you need assistance with flights.

Airport Transfers: Flights should be scheduled to arrive into Ft. Lauderdale no later than 2:00 PM on March 28. Return flights from Ft. Lauderdale should be scheduled no earlier than 11:00 AM on April 4. Holland America's transfers cost \$34 per person each way. Transfers for Miami airport are available for \$80 each way on March 28 for flights arriving MIA by 1 PM or April 4 after 1PM.

Pre & Post-Cruise Hotel Packages: It is highly recommended for all guests to plan to arrive into Ft. Lauderdale by March 27 to allow for the possibility of travel delays. Magic Cruises can book your room at the Hyatt Place Ft. Lauderdale Airport/Cruise Port in Dania Beach for \$279+tax /night. We have a small block of rooms held for the evening of March 27. Alternatively Holland America offers hotel packages that can be added to your cruise reservation.

Travel Documents: Guests are required to complete the online check-in via the Holland America website or app prior to sailing. The app is available for iOS and Android.

Optional Excursions: Holland America offers a wide variety of optional excursions to enhance your cruise experience. Excursions can be reviewed and purchased online after you make your deposit.

Not Included: Items not part of the cruise vacation price include (but are not limited to): airfare, travel insurance, hotel, optional tours, gambling, laundry, and items of a personal nature. Holland America reserves the right to reinstate a fuel surcharge.

PASSPORT INFORMATION:

U.S. Citizens leaving the country are required to carry a Passport Book valid for 6 months past your return travel date. Some cruises sailing round-trip from a US port may allow guests to travel with a government issued birth certificate and state issued ID (like a driver's license) and a marriage license for married ladies (proving name change), in lieu of Passport Book. Passport requirements may change at any time and without a Passport Book you will not be able to fly to/from outside the USA in case of an emergency. Passport Cards are not applicable for international air travel and not recommended. Flights within the U.S. require a REAL ID Driver's License or Passport Book. If you are traveling with minors/children, a passport book, parental permission form and original birth certificate may be required. MAGIC strongly recommends that all Passengers travel with a valid Passport Book. If you are not a US Citizen, it is your responsibility to check with your consulate for travel requirements. Certain destinations may also have their own requirements/restrictions for entry. Travel Visas can be issued online for some countries, but other countries require forms and passports to be mailed to the consulate. There is an extra fee for Travel Visas. Some countries will deny entry if you have been convicted of a felony, have a drunk driving offense or owe back child support (examples only). It is each passenger's responsibility to confirm these requirements. Go to www.travel.state.gov for more details. Other sources of information may be CIBT Visa/Passport services or the web site of the individual country. It is the passenger's responsibility to confirm any requirements for flights, entry into a certain country or to board a cruise ship. 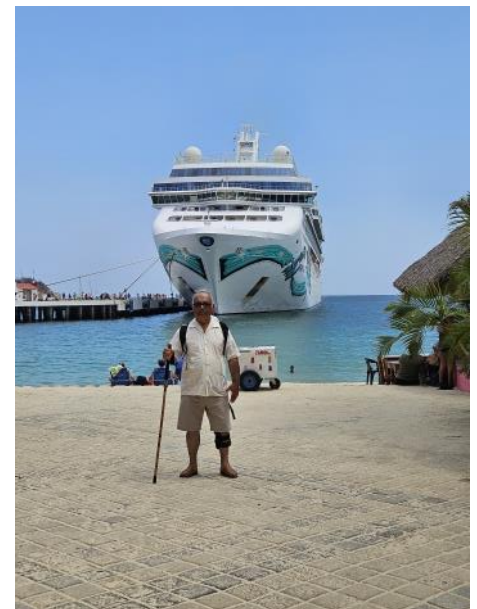
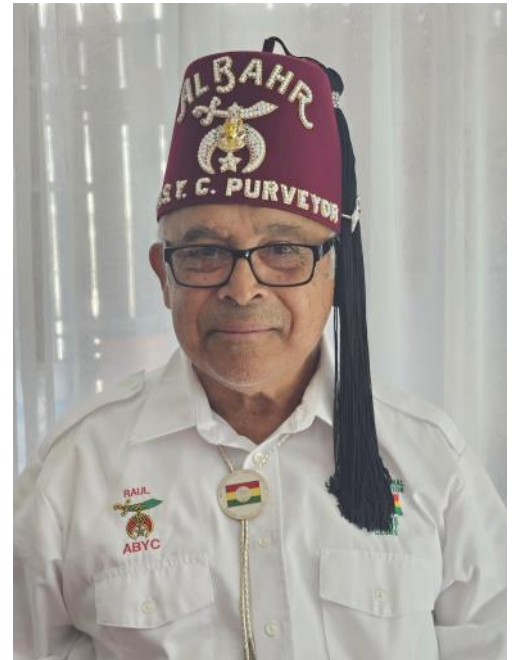

DIRECTOR OF INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The International Development department of IASYC has been incredibly busy this past year. We have traveled to London and Scotland twice in the past year to conduct ceremonials that created new Shriners, and new members of the International Association of Shrine Yacht Clubs. We created over 35 new members for both organizations each trip. IASYC chartered three new International Shrine Yacht Clubs in this time – the London, Edinburgh, and the Glasgow International Shrine Yacht Clubs were chartered in Phase I.

The charters were signed, no less, by Past Imperial Potentate Kenny Craven, who has been helping champion this International Development. He has a personal reason as well as a professional reason for the development of Shrinedom in the British Isles. His ancestor was Lord Craven, who was sent by the King of England to settle and govern Craven County in the colonies. This became South Carolina, and Lord Craven was its first Governor. So Imperial Sir Kenny, an honorary life member of IASYC, has put his energy into this international development.



Imperial Sir Kenny signed the charters at the request of then International Commodore Dan Smith, in Dan's signature line, to show the new Clubs and members of the Shrine's support at the highest International levels, with the blessing of Imperial Potentate Richard Burke at that time. Imperial Sir Kenny physically showed his support by traveling to London and Edinburgh with Past International Commodore Gene Yee, PP, for the conduct of the ceremonials. He convinced Dr. Leslie "Doc" Stewart MD, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Shriners Hospitals for Children International Network to accompany him to London and to Edinburgh. Their Ladies, Lady JJ Crabven, and Lady Meghan Stewart, accompanied them and Yee on the trip and gave rousing support to the Ladies of the Nobles and newly created Nobles in the UK

Phase II of the International Development has now started. Recently, Noble Scott Dunn became the Charter Commodore of the Cinq Ports International Shrine Yacht Club in Kent, England. The Club has 13 Charter members, and all of them are now Life Members of IASYC!! A great start to the new club!! Cinq Ports consists of five ports near Kent, England, and have been a series of five ports serving London and the region for about 800 years, operating since the twelfth century. They include still-working ports including Dover, Sandwich, and Hastings. It was the group of primary ports from whence sailed much commerce and Masons and other sea faring peoples. Many people sailing to and from the American colonies transited through the Cinq Ports. Much of England's successful maritime history revolves around these ports and their limbs, towns in the immediate region.

Noble Commodore Scott has also been appointed an Ambassador of the IASYC by International Commodore Bill Kutschbach, so he can make his appointed rounds. Noble Commodore Scott has also committed to starting another five International Shrine Yacht Clubs in the United Kingdom during this next Shrine Year. Creating new Shriners and new International Shrine Yacht Club members is an exciting development, and a challenge which will solidify the activities and camaraderie of Shriners in the United Kingdom.

The UK Shrine Club is the group helping give birth to all the other Shrine Clubs and the International Shrine Yacht Clubs network throughout the UK. They are currently members of Almas Shriners, headquartered in Washington DC. At the time of this writing, plans are under way for another group of Shrine ceremonials to be held in September in the North and in the South of the UK. The last four Ceremonials were held in London and Edinburgh. Past International Commodore Yee represented the IASYC at these four ceremonials. He also gave the Shriners who were present and the newly created Shriners the best fraternal greetings of the Imperial Potentates at that time, at their specific request as their emissary.
