DO NOT MISS the ever changing floral display in the main hall at the Bellagio. After being the "Big Spender" this display is FREE.

The volcano eruption at the Mirage. (After you have seen one volcano erupt, you've seen them all.)

Too much to handle in four days . . . try the Hospitality Room at the Plaza. BEST DEAL IN LAS VEGAS.

Transportation in Las Vegas: No car? No problem. Monorail between Sahara and MGM Grand Hotels. Five in-between stops. (Expensive at \$5 per person, one way) . . . discounts for multi-ride or all-day pass, but at \$20 per couple round-trip you could hire a cab. COMMITTEE MEMBERS; Richard B. McCord, PC, MAASYC Louis A. Metz, III, PIC, IASYC

At the request of International Commodore, your Committee reviewed the record and accounts of the Secretary/Treasurer and found them to be adequate and complete. Your Committee did, however, make the following suggestions in order to ease the Secretary/Treasurer's records keeping requirements:

- 1) Transfer the Life Savings Account to the Investment Account and then cancel the Life Savings Account.
- 2) Deposit interest from the Investment Account into the Checking Account.
- The terminology used to report the Checking Account balance, especially for activities such as South Padre Island, should include the term "not checking" since this account is unusually large due to paid reservations and unpaid bills for the activity. The "net checking" figure must therefore deduct and estimate of the expenses to be incurred for the activity so as not to mislead the membership into thinking the checking account has an unusually high balance.

As an additional item, we determined that the cost per page to produce and distribute the <u>Shrine Yachtsman</u> is \$150 and for the <u>Dingy</u> it is the same. The annual savings, therefore, by going from four to two editions of the Yachtsman and adding two editions of the Dingy is directly related to the number of pages.
