



INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION of SHRINE YACHT CLUBS SINCE JANUARY 1, 1973

### OUR HISTORY AND MEMBERSHIP

The Commodores of Almas, Boumi, Kena, Lu Lu, Nur and Salaam Temple Yacht Clubs met at Cheny Hill, New Jersey in the spring of 1968. They determined that a Shrine Yachting Association on a national scale comprised of various femple Yacht Clubs was needed to promote further the close relationships that existed within the Mid-Atlantic area among all Shrine boaters. They felt that the Shrine yachting camataderie could be expanded beyond the scope of the Mid-Atlantic region. A rendezvous was held in Atlantic City in September 1968 with a similar rendezvous held each fall since then in connection with the Mid-Atlantic Shrine Association Convention.

Of course, the initial association had no official recognition so one of the primary aims was to develop an organization with prestige and with value to the Shrine. Those Commodores who initiated the original move to form an association were Nelson Lyle of Almas Temple, Warren Benser of Boumi Temple, Charlie Zig of Crescent Temple, Tom Crouch of Dena Temple, Karl Bennung of Lu Lu Temple, Lefty Logan of Nur Temple and Charlie Ulrich of Salaam Temple. Phil Loomis is due recognition for having designed the IASYC burgee and also for developing the initial By-laws of the IASYC.

It was not until April 17, 1973 that the Board of Directors of the Imperial Council officially recognized the international Association of Shrine Yacht Clubs and gave permission for it to continue in existence as of January 1, 1973. In the words of Imperial Potentate Henry B. Struby, "The Chairman of the Jurisprudence and Law Committee has reviewed your By-laws and recommended them for approval, which I hereby grant."

There was a great deal of effort involved in bringing together a group in the Mid-Atlantic Shrine Association as here are twenty-four Temples in that association, and not all had Temple Yacht Clubs. But these men established annual rendezvous which took place at the time of the annual Mid-Atlantic Shrine meeting at which time there was a parade of decorated boats for which prizes were awarded to the best decorated as well as the skipper who had come from the greatest distance in his boat. Rules and regulations had to be drawn up for parade and decoration which have become a part of the records of the IASYC.

At the fall 1973 rendezvous, the first officers of the newly organized IASYC were selected. Kart Bennung, Jr. was named International Commodore, with Warren Benser and Charles Ulrich named International Vice Commodore and Rear Commodore, respectively. Walter Faust was the new Secretary and George Oed the Treasurer. These first officers of the IASYC were successful in working for the IASYC as an official group within the Imperial Council.

At the 100th Imperial Council Session in Atlantic City of June 14, 1974, the first official meeting of the IASYC since it had been approved by the Imperial Council was held. A rendezvous was scheduled for September 1974 at Baltimore in conjunction with the Mid-Atlantic Shrine Association meeting in Washington D.C. At this meeting, special thanks were given to the original Commodoros and other enthusiastic members who had displayed such zeal in the founding of the organization. Among those recognized were Nelson Lyle, Warren Benser, Charlie Zig, Tom Crouch, Karl Bennung, Jr., Lefty Logan, Charlie Ulrich, Phil Loomis, Walter Faust and George Oed.

The Mid-Atlantic Association of Shrine Yacht Clubs, being the originator of the IASYC, were most active in their endeavors to create and maintain strong ties among the member clubs. They had very active cruising groups and Shrine burgees were flown from the staffs of boats up and down the Atlantic coastline from Nantucket to Cape Canaveral. In addition, there were many cookouts and contests to name Princesses and Queens of the Chesapeake. Each of the Mid-Atlantic Association Shrine Yacht Clubs had Commodore's Balls or a Change-of-Watch party to which it was traditional to invite all other club Commodores and their officers thus creating many friendships and strong ties among the clubs.

Wherever Shriner's boats plied the seas displaying their banners and insignia, attention was drawn from other beaters who recognized the symbols and out of curiosity approached the Shriner skipper asking questions. It was not long before the membership began to grow as more interested Shrine boaters from other Temples requested membership in the IASYC. This led to several of the newer members in other Shrine Temples organizing yacht clubs in their Temples with applications coming in from these newly organized Temple yacht clubs to affiliate with the IASYC. The Florida area Temples soon had a number of Temple Yacht Clubs throughout the state and they formed the Florida Shrine Mariners Association.

Much of the growth of the organization and the development of new Temple Yacht Clubs and their affiliation with the IASYC during the period of the late 1970's and 1980's was due to a number of IASYC skippers taking their boats on different cruises and visiting various areas. Naturally, attention was drawn to the Shrine flags flying from the yardarms and staffs of their vessels. This generated a great deal of interest with our skippers visiting the Temples and creating lasting friendships with other Shrine skippers. One of our visiting skippers, George Frohlick, who was the 1984-85 International Commodore of the IASYC, logged many a nautical mile as he traversed the eastern seabcard, the Great Lakes, the waters off Florida and even the Pacific northwest on various boats setling the IASYC along the way. George soon became known as the "Good Will" Ambassador of the IASYC. In those days, the IASYC Secretary, Ken Bellinger answered every inquiry received, visiting a number of the Mid-West Temples and spread the word wherever he went. Ken was succeeded by Gene Dangerfield who combined the offices of Secretary and Treasurar into one. He computerized all our data, and in his large motor home traveled every summer across the country and into Canada visiting Shriners along the way. The dedication of such men had a great deal to do with the growth of the IASYC. We are extremely fortunate to have Lou Metz as our Secretary and Treasurer. Lou has been able to invest IASYC funds to receive the maximum returns assuring us financial stability in the 21st Century.

From the beginning, the IASYC put out a newsletter which went out to each of the member clubs as well as to individual members on a regular basis. After George Frohlick completed his term of office as International Commodore, he accepted the position as Editor of the Shrine Yachtsman with its interesting news and pictures from various member clubs.

In 1986, Past International Commodore Martin Wener was instructed to review the By-laws of the IASYC and to update them to reflect the the current situation of the organization due to its rapid growth. After a six month study, a completely revised and updated set of By-laws were presented to the membership at its 1987 Mid-Winter Meeting and after being unanimously approved was submitted to the Imperial Jurisprudence and Law Committee which granted approval on July 23, 1987. A further update of the By-laws was approved by the Imperial Jurisprudence and Law Committee on July 3, 1991.

Started as a club within the Shrine composed of Shrine boaters in 1971, the IASYC today represents among its affiliated Shrine Temple Yacht Clubs the ambassadors of good will among the boating fraternity. It is a private, self supporting, fratemal Shrine boating association dedicated to the furtherance of the aims of Shrinedom. It has grown and developed since its infancy from the Atlantic scaboard to all areas of the country from coast to coast into Canada and to

Alaska and Hawaii. Its growth and expansion continues with no end in sight. We consider ourselves the most family oriented and the premier organization in all Shrineedom.



Therefore, we must make trip back to Hotel and pick up luggage for transport to Cruise ship. That's why the 11:30 to 12 noon deal to give a BIT of time to clear out of the room.

Any first time cruisers should be aware there is "motion to the ocean". Take precautions with proper medication, JUST IN CASE. We expect a very calm cruise.


Bring sunscreen, warm clothing (for those ocean breezes), and a BIG appetite.
