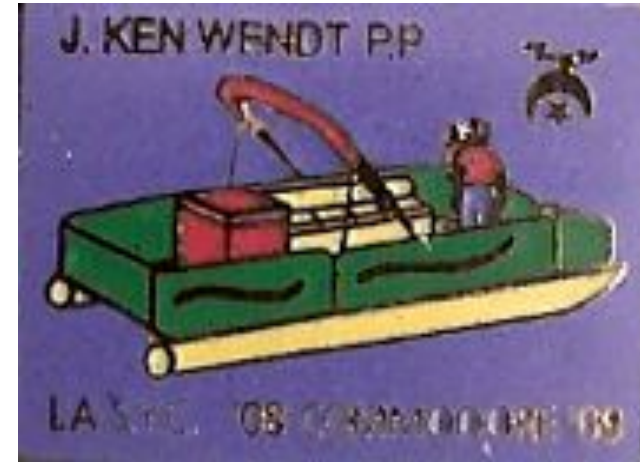

Good of the Order- PIC Richard Markson stated that he talked with one of the \$12.00 donors , William E. Jane, Jr. , who was one of the original Charter Members.

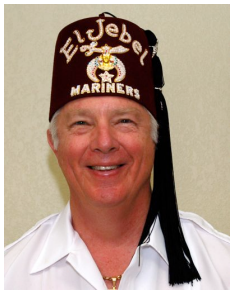

The Historians Corner
4 July 2008

Recently one of the charter members, William Jayne, of the IASYC and I exchanged E mails talking about some of the Founding Fathers of this organization. They were quite a diverse group of men but they all were achievers and products of The American Dream. We had Presidents of large corporations and a VP of a local Gas and Electric Company and many entrepreneurs who had built their own businesses, a few lawyers and some doctors. You can imagine the heated discussions that went on in such a gathering of strong willed men. But at the end of the day we ended up with a great organization. It would be difficult to put together something like that today.

The political and economic situation was entirely different at that time. Many boats were registered (Documented) to Corporations and private businesses meaning that they could write off their expenses. If you registered your boat with the Coast Guard you did not even have to buy the state license and there was no personal property tax. Also, at the end of the year we sent our gas receipts to the state and they refunded the

state gas tax because we were not using the highways. I recall when I was Fleet Captain of Boumi Temple Yacht Club in 1969 approximately half of the checks that came in for a cruise were written on business checks. We had five cruises during the season and anywhere from twenty to forty boats on a cruise. Now we are hard pressed to get twenty people to come to a meeting.

In the late forties gas was 25 Cents a gallon. That was when a silver quarter was worth 25 cents. When you look at it from the standpoint that the silver in that quarter is worth about \$4.50 now it makes it sound better, but such is not the case, it does not help our situation. If you would like more information about the oil problems there is an interesting book by Lindsey Williams entitled The Energy Non Crisis and Newt Gingrich has voiced his opinion on the subject very well. I will give you a couple of web links at the end of this article.

Two hundred and thirty some years ago when taxes got out of control there was a Tea Party. I think our tea party should be for every law abiding tax paying citizen to contact their representatives and tell them if they don't lift oil exploration restrictions, and start a crash program to build nuclear power generating stations we will not vote for them in November. I will guarantee you if we could assemble that group of men mentioned above this would be the topic of conversation and there would be an action plan put into place.

Nobles November is getting very close.
