I can report that the committee created at the July meeting in Charlotte and chaired by PIC Ronnie Markham has completed the initial part of the project by recreating a new brochure. The second leg was to survey the market

to acquire an economical, efficient and reputable printer. The next phase of the project will be to distribute the flyers to our representative officers for distribution. I am very proud of the work that has been accomplished to date. Not to steal their thunder but I am so proud of this Bridge. Rear Commodore Don Gortowski in addition to being a member of this committee has been working on the possibilities of creating an all inclusive calendar web site which

In my last article I stated that we are attempting to increase the number of Yachtsman publications. However we need to be more efficient in our method of operation. We cannot continue to spend your funds recklessly with this project. We will increase the number of copies created but we can only mail twice annually. We want to increase the number published to four times annually but twice during the year a copy can be mailed and the other two publications will be delivered to your e-mail address electronically or you can visit the IASYC web site to obtain a copy. We have updated our data to include about 50 percent of the e-mail addresses. So I need your help as members to send to me whether or not you can and are willing to assist us and receive your copy by e-mail only or if you do not have an e-mail account or just prefer to have a copy physically mailed to your home. Please take the time to consider how best we can serve your needs on this topic and e-mail me your concerns and recommendations either pro or con. My e-mail address is lonlramos@aol.com. Also it has come to my attention that many members have moved residences and their friends have lost contact with them and on occasion a member may fall ill and be placed in a nursing facility or worse pass beyond the bar. This information does not seem to get passed on to interested friends and co-shrine members. "Life" is a gift to you. The way you live your life is your gift to those who come after. Make it a fantastic one.




